Father's Corner

Martha or Mary?

The Gospel for this 16th Sunday presents us with two women who open the door of their house and offer hospitality to Jesus; Martha and Mary. And while Martha prepares the meal, Mary remains seated at Jesus' feet and listens to him.

Martha and Mary adopt two very different attitudes in welcoming Jesus. Both adore Jesus indeed, but while Martha is busy preparing a good meal and trying to earn a reputation of an incomparable cook, Mary is attentive to Jesus' words.

This Sunday's Gospel tells us that we are more often Martha than Mary. Indeed, modern life advocates excessive activity and, like Martha, we are excessively agitated; an agitation that leads to a certain tension that withdraws us into ourselves. So many times Jesus asks us to cast our worries on God who feeds the little birds and sumptuously clothes the lilies of the field. Jesus does not reproach Martha for taking the trouble to receive him, but the nervousness and excess of agitation which make her forget the essential.

Listening to the Word of God is the first duty of a Christian. He who has no time for it, builds on the sand. But listening to the Word plants us on a rich soil that bears fruit, a fruit that remains.

The glory of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was not to have been chosen to be the Mother of a God made man, but it was to keep God's Word in her heart and put it into practice. (Luke 11: 27-28).

Fr. Florent's Installation Mass

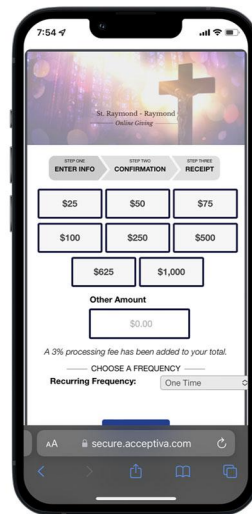
