Father's Corner

“I have come to set the earth on fire.”

The Book of the Prophet Jeremiah and the letter to the Hebrews help us to understand the words of Jesus in the Gospel of this Sunday. This Gospel speaks to us, as Saint Paul would say, of the 'pains of childbirth.' To gain access to life, to be reborn from the Spirit, we must burn down all that is sin and death drives in our lives. We must separate and divide what is good from what is bad, what is right from what is unjust, what is essential from what is accessory.

We have to separate the wheat from the chaff. But beware, the main fight is not first in the heart of the family, but in the heart of each of us. It is first within ourselves that we must carry out this fight and light this fire Jesus talks about.

Family relationships will then be the first sign that the kingdom is realized in our hearts. When, at the heart of families, divisions will disappear, when we will be able to live as brothers and sisters in the peace of Christ, then his purifying fire will have fulfilled its mission.

And the family of which we speak will also be that of any Christian community, that of the relations between Christian churches, those of the relations between all the men and women of this earth. Then, the pains of childbirth will disappear and a new world will come to light, the world that God gave us at the beginning when he created the world, the world that Jesus came to renew by his death and resurrection.

We therefore still have a long way to go to set the world on fire; and the words of today's liturgy are still relevant for each of us, for our community, for our Church, for our world.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Code of Canon Law speaks of pastoral councils on Canon 536

Importance of Parish Pastoral Councils

Can. 536

§1. If the diocesan bishop judges it opportune after he has heard the presbyteral council, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish, over which the pastor presides and in which the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in fostering pastoral activity.

§2. A pastoral council possesses a consultative vote only and is governed by the norms established by the diocesan bishop.

Mission statement

The mission statement comes from an understanding of the local church's place within the Universal Church and how the work of a particular Parish contributes to the building up of the Kingdom of God here on earth. It should incorporate the priorities of the Holy Father, of the local Diocesan Bishop and the local parish.

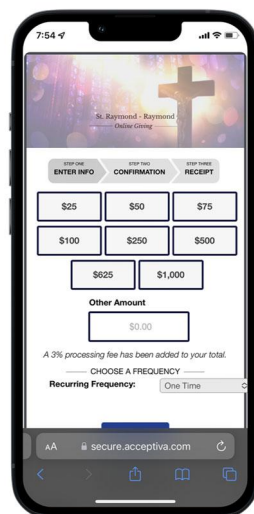
