Father's Corner

You will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.

Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus is received by a Pharisee on a Sabbath. By accepting this invitation from a Pharisee, Jesus is aware that he is being spied on, and that all his actions are judged with malice. He still accepts this invitation for a meal.

It is not a course in proprieties that Jesus gives us here, but he teaches us on the spirit of the Gospel which is in itself a Manual of "good manners". Indeed if all men conformed their conduct to the Gospel, how good would the earth be for all to inhabit!

Jesus does not lose sight of the Kingdom and He uses the most ordinary actions that we experience daily to illustrate the attitudes that befit those who aspire to the Kingdom. The true Christian life is on the lookout for everything, even the most ordinary meal. It is the whole being and its action that are called to convert in order to enter the Kingdom. Besides, there are no small things and those who despise the details will never be able to access great things.

Therefore our love must be free and freely offered to anyone who crosses our path. This is why, as the Lord loves us without any merit on our part, we too must love those around us as they are without wanting to change them and turn them to our liking.

It sometimes happens that we receive ingratitude from those we help, and perhaps anger rises in us. Let's not forget that the Lord shines his sun on the good and on the wicked. Let us also think of our own ingratitude towards God who still fulfills us every day anyway.

Role and Function of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC)

(part 3)

The PPC practices **discernment** and **consensus** in the decision-making process. Discernment and consensus require patience and respect. Discernment is a process of decision-making that utilizes listening to the word of God, and reflecting on the mission of Jesus, the mission of the universal Church, and the mission of the parish. Discernment requires an open mind and an open heart. Consensus is discerning together, as a Council, as a body. Although the body of the PPC has several members, when a decision has been made through prayerful discernment, the Council expresses unity – unity of spirit, and unity of purpose.

Coming to consensus requires sometimes dying to self and focusing on the common good, to attributes of discipleship. Consensus means not insisting on our own way. Consensus requires humility, honesty, integrity, and gentleness. The capacity for prayerful contemplation is essential in the discernment process.

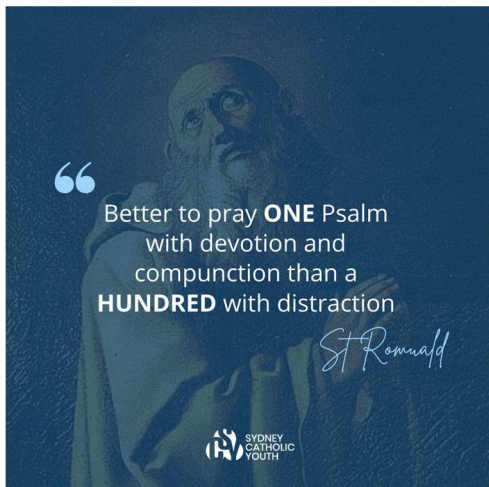

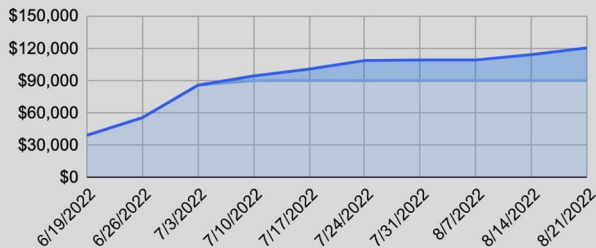
