## Father's Corner

---

### By your perseverance you will secure your lives...

Where can we find security when everything seems to collapse?

Jesus' words in the Gospel of this penultimate Sunday of the Liturgical Year could easily describe our world today. Nations continue to rise against nations (Russia, Ukraine, NATO...). Families continue to rise against families. And even our own Church seems to be collapsing with recent scandals within her in recent years. Fires, earthquakes, tsunamis, famines, floods, pandemics are common occurrence. Even so, we are called to take comfort in the words of Jesus' in the Gospel: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

When it comes to perseverance, many realities can come to mind. Sometimes perseverance takes the form of choosing to love our spouse and children everyday, even when it seems impossible. Sometimes it looks like fighting injustice. Sometimes it's simply taking time for prayer, everyday. In all of these cases and more, our relationship with God grounds us and gives us life.

The powerful images in the Gospel of today are certainly catastrophic and scary, however they are also full of hope for us believers. Because in them we see not only what the end of times might look like, but more importantly, they reveal something about God and our relationship with Him. We only need not to be afraid but persevere in doing good till the end.



### Where did these "For the Parishioners" masses come from?

Over the last year you've probably noticed that between our three parishes, Father will offer one mass each week for all our parishioners. Recently, someone asked if this meant we didn't have enough requested mass intentions and were using these as fillers, which is not the case. This is actually a requirement in the Code of Canon Law, #534, which states:

- 1. After a pastor has taken possession of his parish, he is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation in his diocese. If he is legitimately impeded from this celebration, however, he is to apply it on the same days through another or on other days himself.*
- 2. A pastor who has the care of several parishes is bound to apply only one Mass for the entire people entrusted to him on the days mentioned in section 1.*
- 3. A pastor who has not satisfied the obligation mentioned in section 1 and 2 is to apply as soon as possible as many Masses for the people as he has omitted.*

Our parishes had been unaware of this law until Fr. Burnette arrived and brought it to our attention. Since we are a 3 parish unit and only one parish needs to host the mass each week, we rotate the obliged mass between the three parishes, doing our best to accommodate requested mass intentions from parishioners.
