Father's Corner

As we celebrate this great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe on this Last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, it will be helpful to remember the beginning of our Lord's ministry.

While he was tempted by the Devil in the desert, the Gospel reads, "when the Devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time." Yes, the Devil did not give up, but awaited for good occasions to resume temptation. As we read the Gospel of this Solemnity, we seem to hear the Devil through the soldiers jeering: "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself."

Jesus is the best example of kingship because he rejects these false notions of power and authority that has plagued the history of humanity up to this day. Indeed Jesus does not act in selfishness or self-interest as the leaders of our world do. As always, he lives for others and he calls us to do just the same. And from the top of his life-giving cross, he offers forgiveness and salvation to the repentant thief and to all of us.

As we look forward to the new Liturgical Year that starts next Sunday with Advent, may we remember this image of Christ the King and turn to it often. Because it helps us to understand what being a citizen of Christ's Kingdom is all about.

At the very beginning of our Christian lives we were anointed priest, prophet and king. May we be able to embrace that kingship of Jesus; a kingship completely turned towards the service of others, transforming death into life, and violence into love.

Where did these "For the Parishioners" masses come from?

Over the last year you've probably noticed that between our three parishes, Father will offer one mass each week for all our parishioners. Recently, someone asked if this meant we didn't have enough requested mass intentions and were using these as fillers, which is not the case. This is actually a requirement in the Code of Canon Law, #534, which states:

1. *After a pastor has taken possession of his parish, he is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation in his diocese. If he is legitimately impeded from this celebration, however, he is to apply it on the same days through another or on other days himself.*
2. *A pastor who has the care of several parishes is bound to apply only one Mass for the entire people entrusted to him on the days mentioned in section 1.*
3. *A pastor who has not satisfied the obligation mentioned in section 1 and 2 is to apply as soon as possible as many Masses for the people as he has omitted.*

Our parishes had been unaware of this law until Fr. Burnette arrived and brought it to our attention. Since we are a 3 parish unit and only one parish needs to host the mass each week, we rotate the obliged mass between the three parishes, doing our best to accommodate requested mass intentions from parishioners.
