## **FATHER'S COLUMN**

The landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?'
They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.'

Staying idle and waiting is not necessarily inactivity. It can be a form of activity. The laborers in the marketplace in this parable can be thought of as merely "standing idle," but they can also be interpreted as actively waiting to provide a laborer's service.

Their wait is productive, for the landowner persistently returns to the marketplace throughout the day to hire laborers for his vineyard. They are hired. That is one surprise of the Gospel. Another surprise is that, no matter the hour of being hired, they are all given the full daily wage.

This parable is likened to the "kingdom of heaven." God is persistent in calling us and giving those who are faithful the full wage of salvation. All we need to do is wait, respond, serve. So, how do we wait?

We are actively awaiting God's call when we, for example, remain persistent in prayer, patiently listen to others in their need to go on and on about their life difficulties, engage in careful discernment about something important in our life rather than act on a hasty decision. Our patient response in these and many other daily situations strengthens us to be faithful on our journey of salvation. Our very waiting is a way we already serve God and others and receive the full wage God offers: Salvation.

## YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST REFLECTIONS

The Lord's Prayer: When we say the Our Father, why do Catholics say it in two separated parts at Mass?

Jesus gave the Our Father prayer to us, it is based on the two versions in the Gospels of Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4. Matthew's version is most commonly used.

The Lord's Prayer is sometimes concluded with the doxology [For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever.]

The doxology is not found in the original texts of the Bible. It is first found in the 'Didache' (around year 70), which is The Teaching of the Apostles.

Catholics do not end the Our Father with the doxology, but separate it in the Mass, recognizing that the two prayers are distinct. Protestants and Eastern Christians often attach the doxology to the Our Father. The Lord's Prayer is "truly the summary of the whole Gospel."

## Diocesan Annual Respect Life Mass and Rosary Walk

Saturday, October 7 at Holy Family Parish in Granite City. Bishop Paprocki will celebrate Mass at 9 am, followed by a prayer procession around the abortion facility in Granite City. Lunch and speaker will follow the procession.

## Receive an Indulgence by Visiting The Cathedral in Springfield or Ss. Peter and Paul Church in Alton

Bishop Thomas John Paprocki received permission from the Holy See, granting a plenary indulgence to those who make a pilgrimage to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield or Ss. Peter and Paul Church in Alton (the "Old Cathedral") now through Dec. 8. One must also partake in the other usual conditions to receive this indulgence by going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and saying prayers for the intention of the Pope. These acts "may be carried out several days preceding or following the performance of the prescribed works. But it is more fitting that communion and the prayer for the pope's intentions take place on the day the work is performed" (Handbook of Indulgences, Norms for Indulgences, 23.3). An indulgence is a gift and grace that remits the temporal punishment due to a sin.
