FATHER'S COLUMN

"The king dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come."

In what circumstances do people refuse appealing invitations? It happens when there is a conflict of commitments, or when distance is too long and expenses too high, when unexpected illness afflicts them. Sometimes we simply cannot respond positively. With the invitation to come to the banquet in the "kingdom of heaven," however, there are no complex circumstances that could prevent a positive and definite response from us.

Jesus said, "Many are invited, but few are chosen." From the parable this Sunday, we know that the king was intransigent about filling the wedding hall with guests and was very persistent about this even to the point of having his servants be rather indiscriminate ("bad and good alike") concerning who they gather for the feast.

The "few" chosen are those who say yes to the invitation and to what it entails. God's gracious invitations require our positive and definite response. At stake is Eternal Life.

What do invitations to be in the "kingdom of heaven" look like? Sometimes we must choose between doing good or not. At other times we must choose to be attentive to another in spite of our own inconvenience. Or we must choose to be faithful to prayer, to be open to God's Presence, to participate fully in the sacraments. Our faithful responses witness to the presence of God's kingdom among us and the fullness of Life toward which we are growing.

Year of the Eucharist Reflections

Throughout her history, the Church made some changes to the Mass. Can the Mass be changed altogether?

Christ Himself instituted the Mass and the Eucharist. The Mass is only valid if a validly ordained priest celebrates it with valid matter, bread and wine, and valid form, the proper words of the Prayer of Consecration. Beyond this, the Mass may be revised according to the charism of the infallible authority of the Magisterium in the areas of various customs, prayers, and matters of smaller traditions within the Mass. The Mass has been recently revised around the instructions of Vatican II, and afterwards up to our time, in various small matters. In some ways, the Church is always in reform in her practices and customs; but this does not mean any of her truths and doctrines ever change. The Holy Spirit guides the Church in major and minor matters for the good of the faithful, and thus, obedience to the Church's guidance is called for from the faithful. While being obedient, the faithful may also continue to desire further revision and renewal as well.
