FATHER'S COLUMN

His master said to him, "Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities."

If a piano student does not practice, he will not grow into a proficient musician; parents who do not invest time and energy in the formation of their children from birth onward restrict their growth in values and acceptable social behaviors. Equally, a gardener who does not water plants of his garden often and early jeopardizes their growth and even can kill them. Those who do not choose to nurture the divine Life given to them at Baptism will bring upon themselves the judgment of losing their very selves when Judgment Day comes.

In this Gospel parable which directs our attention to the end times and the final judgment, Jesus challenges us to choose daily to increase the incalculable riches (Divine Life) God has given us. This requires from us to choose trust over fear, good over wickedness, disciplined and courageous work over laziness. Jesus challenges us to be faithful servants who choose to allow this Divine Life to increase and grow within us. To choose otherwise is to bury our talents, our very selves.

But what are the riches God has given us? The indwelling of the Holy Spirit, union with Christ in his Body, adoption as God's children and heirs of the kingdom.

What does it mean to increase these riches? To invest in bringing goodness and love to others, to expend our energy making God's Presence in the world evident, to reach out to anyone in need.

What reward do we receive? Even more of God's Life, even a greater bond of unity with Christ and others. We find our very selves.

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST REFLECTIONS

What is the benefit of receiving Holy Communion?

Those who receive Holy Communion receive Jesus Christ glorified, fully in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, which is referred to as the "total Christ." This is the greatest source of grace, and thus increases the life of God within us. They receive Him and enter into deep communion with Him Who is really and sacramentally within them. The Eucharist helps them to love others with the love of God. It cleanses them from venial sin and strengthens them against sin and temptation. It fosters their service to Christ and His Church, and the needs of others. Jesus promised that he who eats His Flesh and drinks His Blood shall have eternal life and be raised on the last day (John 6:54).
