FATHER'S COLUMN

John the Baptist was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus.

What kind of people immediately attract us? The Pretty? Energetic? Intellectuals? Humorous? Honest? Trustworthy? Self-possessed? Humble? Wealthy? Powerful?

What happens to our attraction as we get to know a person on a deeper level? Sometimes the attraction fades. At other times the attraction develops into an enduring bond.

The two disciples in the Gospel of this Sunday were so attracted to Jesus that they immediately followed him.

What did they see in Jesus? When John the Baptist points out Jesus to his two disciples, they call Jesus "Rabbi." They saw in Jesus knowledge, they saw wisdom, they saw authority.

What they did not yet see is that Jesus was the "Lamb of God" who would sacrifice his own life for our salvation. Nor did they see that this sacrifice would also be asked of them as his followers.

Our own journey of discipleship is a process of coming to know Jesus more fully, being more attracted to him, following him more faithfully even when the cost is expensive.

What might that cost look like? We might have to walk away from the dispenser-machine at work to avoid gossip... We might lose some of our friends when we speak for justice... We might be shunned by a social group when we live out our Gospel values. In all these ways we unite ourselves more fully with the total self-giving of Jesus and grow in faithful discipleship.

EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION

What is the most precious treasure of the Catholic Church?

The most precious treasure is the Holy Eucharist, the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is the greatest pledge of Christ's immense love for us and His continued Presence with us until the end of time. It is "the source and summit of the whole Christian life" (Vatican II).

The Eucharist is Jesus Christ now on earth no less than He is now in Heaven, and no less truly than He was on earth in the first century Holy Land, now under the appearance of bread and wine.

What is Mary's role in relation to the Eucharist?

The Church calls Mary the Mother of the Eucharist. Because she gave to her Son, Jesus, His Flesh and Blood from her own body. That's why Saint Augustine said that, in the Eucharist, "the flesh of Jesus is the flesh of Mary."

A LETTER FROM OUR BISHOP

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has been a way for Catholics in the United States to unite more closely with our brothers and sisters in faith throughout Latin America and the Caribbean through supporting diocesan pastoral catechetical and family life ministries, seminary studies, and formation programs for religious sisters and brothers. The collection even helps the poorest dioceses obtain basic necessities that they otherwise would be unable to afford, which would leave them unable to minister effectively to the faithful.

At the far eastern end of the island of Cuba, the priests in the Diocese of Guantanamo-Baracoa traverse bad roads over rough terrain to bring the sacraments and the Word of God to the faithful living there. The mountainous territory that makes up 75% of the diocese's total land area makes travel not only difficult but also more expensive for priests due to higher fuel consumption, vehicle maintenance, and repair costs compared to other regions.

Catholics like you who generously contribute to the Collection for the Church in Latin America help Guantanamo-Baracoa's priests stay on the road with funds given to the diocese to offset fuel and vehicle repair costs. In places such as Cuba, you help bring the Good News to the poor when you participate in the collection.

Our diocese takes up this collection on the weekend of January 27/28, 2024. Please be generous toward this collection. Consider giving at Mass or through your parish's online giving platform. The #iGiveCatholicTogether (usccb.igivecatholictogether.orgl organizations/usccb-church-in-latin-america) website also accepts online funds for the collection. Your support truly makes a difference.
