FATHER'S COLUMN

They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage.

After hearing the Gospel of this feast, we can easily get distracted by focusing on the star and the "three kings." Over the years, much has been said and written about what the star actually was; some thought it was a comet, others that it was two planets just crossing their paths... And again, who the Magi really were? Were they three? Were they truly kings? What Saint Matthew is actually concerned with, however, is something more significant: the universality of salvation. Jesus came for the Salvation of humankind.

God offers salvation to all people, Israelites and gentiles (Magi) alike. Moreover, God offers salvation through every possible means: the little town of Bethlehem, the machinations of an evil king...

In order for us to find the newborn King (which is actually, a description of our journey to salvation), we must not only be persevering in our search but also be open to surprising ways in which God reveals salvation to us.

Perhaps the biggest surprise is when God comes to us in old places and familiar faces, such as through the people we know all too well: members of our immediate family, next-door neighbors, even our enemies. Here is where we might encounter the newborn King today. To do so however, we must set aside prejudices and biases which could keep our eyes from seeing God's self-revelation in unexpected persons and places.

EUCHARISTIC REFLECTIONS

How does Mass end?

Just as Mass began with certain prayers, so it ends in a similar fashion. The priest gives a final blessing and dismisses (missa) the assembly. Sometimes, a few brief announcements precede the priest's prayers at this time. Then, priest says: "Go in peace." And we respond: "Thanks be to God." The priest kisses the altar, as when he began Mass, and he leaves with the others, as in the entrance procession, usually accompanied by a song. All give thanks and praise to God!
