St. Alphonsus Liguori said: "Of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the sacraments, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us." St Pope John Paul II said: "The worship of the Eucharist is of inestimable value."

FATHER'S COLUMN

Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him,
"I do will it. Be made clean."

Most likely none of us has encountered someone with Ebola's disease. However we have all had experience with those who are outcasts, or with feeling ourselves alienated from our family or from our community. Today's "lepers" might well be those suffering from AIDS or substance abuse, those from a different cultural or racial background, those having a different sexual orientation, those who are homeless, or a family member guilty of crossing a line of acceptable behavior or a coworker who seems "lazy."

The saying goes, "Tell me who your friends are, and I'll tell you who you are." Jesus deliberately identified himself with outcasts and the alienated: lepers, sinners, women, foreigners, tax collectors. The first thing Jesus did was accept the other; then, in some cases, he cured them and in other cases he called them to change. Always, he was compassionate. We, too, are called to have the compassion of Jesus and to reach out to those who feel alienated. Often this requires us, as it did Jesus, to run the risk of being rejected ourselves.

EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION

Do the Saints really say that the best time we can have on earth is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Saints have said that the greatest time we will ever spend on earth and the time we will be most thankful for in Heaven is the time we spend with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

- St. John Vianney said: "In Heaven we will consider these moments with the Lord as the happiest of our earthly lives."
- St. Teresa of Calcutta said: "I make a Holy Hour each day in the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament... through our daily Holy Hour our love for Jesus becomes more intimate, our love for each other more understanding, and our love for the poor more compassionate... The time you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the best time that you will spend on earth. Each moment that you spend with Jesus will deepen your union with Him and make your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in Heaven, and will bring about everlasting peace on earth."

Lenten Regulations

Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All the Christian faithful are urged to develop and maintain a voluntary program of self-denial (in addition to the Lenten regulations which follow), serious prayer and the performing of deeds of charity and mercy, including the giving of alms.

ABSTINENCE - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

FAST - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
