FATHER'S COLUMN

There are details in today's resurrection Gospel that may seem a bit strange. The passage begins: "On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark." Likewise, the account of the disciples running to the tomb also has very specific elements: "They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first." The detail John provides in his resurrection account gives credibility and factual grounding to the story, as they were specific details observed by those first witnesses of the resurrection.

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles also emphasizes this notion of witness. Peter proclaims: "We are witnesses of all that he did." The word "witness" comes from the Latin *testimonium*, or one who testifies. While we may not be called to spread the Gospel across the country or the world. Still, we must testify to the death and resurrection of Jesus by our daily actions.

Thus Easter calls us out of the darkness that shrouds our lives into the light of new life, of healing, of re-creation. In his rising from the dead, Christ enables us to bring into our own lives all that he taught and lived throughout his life: the love, compassion, generosity, humility, and selflessness that ultimately triumphs over hatred, bigotry, prejudice, despair, greed, and death.

We sometimes find ourselves stuck in a Good Friday world: our problems hit us, overwhelm us, strain our strength and ability to cope and make it all work. But in raising his Son from the dead, the Father vindicates the Gospel of his Christ: that good conquers evil, that love transforms hatred, that light shatters the darkness. Our lives are filled with experiences of resurrection, when the despair and desperation of our Good Fridays are transformed into Easter hope by the compassion and mercy of those who have embraced the good news of Easter morning.

He is Risen, Alleluia!

Explanation: On Good Friday we remember the day Jesus was crucified. In The Latin Rite, there is no celebration of Mass between the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening and the Easter Vigil unless a special exemption is granted for rare solemn or grave occasions by the Vatican or the local bishop. The only sacraments celebrated during this time are Baptism (for those in danger of death), Penance, and Anointing of the Sick. While there is no celebration of the Eucharist, Holy Communion is still distributed to the faithful only in the Service of the Passion of the Lord, but can also be taken at any hour to the sick who are unable to attend this service.
