## **FATHER'S COLUMN**

Jesus said, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing."

In Jesus' image of the vine and branches, we realize that we are connected to one another as Church, we belong to one another as family, we are branches of the same vine planted by the Father, the vine grower.

In Christ, we are sustained in God's grace throughout time and space; despite our different races and creeds, our nationalities and cultures, we are branches that draw life from this same root. On the night before he died (the setting of the Gospel of this Sunday), Jesus reminds his disciples of every generation that, in his love, we are "grafted" to one another in ways we do not completely realize or understand. As branches of Christ the Vine, we are part of something greater than ourselves, something that transforms us and goes beyond our fragile lives.

Our lives can become strangled by fear and self-satisfaction. The demands on our lives that render us unable to love can be the overgrowth of the branch that isolates us from others, and keeps us in isolation and loneliness. When this happens, we can be assured that the Father, the vine grower, will "prune" away the excess and the useless, the dysfunctional and the broken part of us in order that we might produce more fruit.

Our place at God's table in eternity, our worthiness to be called disciples of Christ is determined not by races, not by titles, not by our facility to talk about our beliefs, not by our self imagined greatness, but by our belief in Jesus our Risen Lord, and our remaining courageously in him. We are united to him as a branch to the vine in vital connection. As the branch is pruned to bear more fruit, so anyone who remains in Christ should expect to be "pruned" to bear more fruit as well.
