

FATHER'S COLUMN

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body."

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.

The gift of the Eucharist comes to us with an important "string" attached: it must be shared. In sharing the Body of Christ, we become the Body of Christ. We become what we receive; what we consume now consumes us. If we partake of the one bread and one cup, then we must be willing to become Eucharist for others: to make Christ's love real for all. Our coming to the eucharistic table is more than just reliving the memory of Christ's great sacrifice for our redemption: in sharing his body in the bread of the Eucharist, we reenter the inexplicable love of God who gives us eternal life in his Son, the risen Christ; in drinking his blood in the wine of the Eucharist we take his life into the very core of our beings.

When we gather here at this table, we take bread and wine to remember Jesus: the very love of God. We come to the Eucharist to celebrate his presence among us and recommit ourselves to following his example of compassion and justice; in doing so, we rediscover our identity as his disciples and reaffirm our baptismal commitment to become his body and blood for others. At Christ's table, we are always welcome. In celebrating Jesus' great gift of the Eucharist, we make our parish family's table a place of reconciliation and compassionand we make all our family tables places of love and safety where Christ is present in our service and care for one another.

This meal is the living sign of our covenant with God. In this sacrament, bread and wine are transformed by the Spirit of God into the Body and Blood of Christ. In turn, the sacrament we receive transforms us into sacraments and signs of God's love for our families and communities. As the Eucharist makes us a Church of reconciliation, so it makes us reconcilers; as the Eucharist animates the Church with Christ's life, so it animates our lives in God's love and compassion. This bread and cup also makes of us a community with those all over the world: from those gathering around the altars of magnificent cathedrals, to those huddled around scraps of bread on dirt floors. Regardless of the venue and circumstances, the risen One welcomes us all and all we are - we come with all our joys and sorrows to be nourished at the great banquet of his Body and Blood.
