FATHER'S COLUMN

Jesus woke up, rebuked the wind,
and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!"
The wind ceased and there was great calm.
Then he asked them,
"Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

Parents understand quite well the responsibility and privilege of calling and leading their children beyond where they are at any stage in their lives. For example, encouraging a toddler to stand and walk his/her first steps, encouraging a youngster to ride a bike, or a teenager to make right decisions, etc.

Basic to this process is parents teaching their children to trust their own innate abilities and grow into capable and independent adults. Our faith journey is a similar process.

Even though the disciples had already experienced some of Jesus' miracles, this new situation at sea was different: the violence of the storm threatened their lives and was beyond their power to control. Jesus' care for them and his power over creation led them to greater faith and trust.

Ultimately, Jesus is the "parent" who calls us, his disciples today, to go beyond our own previous experiences and our limited understanding of his presence in our lives.

In the "storms" of our own lives, Jesus is always present through other people, within ourselves, in the very challenge of the situation. Each challenge in life offers us more and more reasons to trust in Jesus: concrete evidence of our continual growth in faith.
