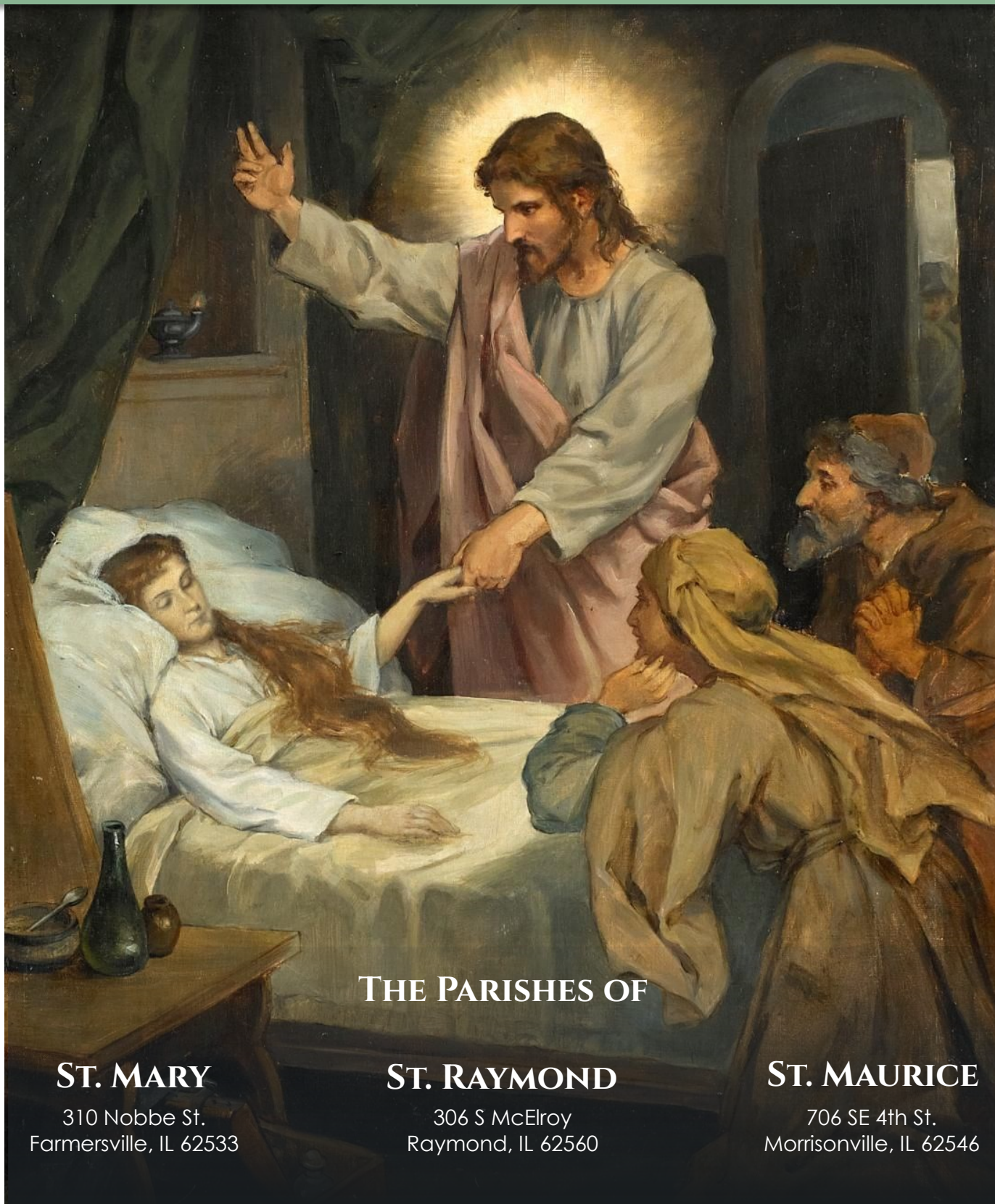

## FATHER'S COLUMN

The afflicted woman said,  
"If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured."

How powerful a touch can be! The caress of a parent on a child's cheek, a cool hand on a fevered brow, and the brush of a kiss between spouses, all have an inherent power to connect individuals well beyond the touch itself.

Faith is a way we touch and are touched by Jesus, unleashing a power that brings new life.

Frequently in the Gospels, Jesus' gift of healing is preceded by an act of faith. Faith is critical to healing and salvation because faith establishes the deep connection, the close relationship with Jesus that allows his power to be effective. Faith is our touching Jesus. Faith is our response to Jesus.

Both Jairus and the woman in the Gospel of this Sunday entrusted themselves to Jesus by coming to him. They had faith. They moved beyond the known (illness and death) to reach into the unknown of new possibilities for life (health and life). Risking disappointment, they reached out to Jesus with confidence that he would respond to their need.

In our own times of need, they show us the way to healing and wholeness, that whatever is dead within us may be restored to life in Jesus' divine love and power.
