## **FATHER'S COLUMN**

Jesus asked them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ."

The question Jesus poses to his disciples, he also poses to us: Who do you say I am? Every decision we make, every action we take, proclaims who we believe Jesus is and what his Gospel means to us. Sometimes answering that question demands that we put aside our fears and self-importance to say to ourselves and our community, "You are the Christ, whom God has sent to teach us His way of humble gratitude, joyful service, and just peace." Our love for family and friends, our commitment to the highest moral standards, our willingness to take the first step toward reconciliation and forgiveness, is our confession of faith in Jesus as the Love and Word of God incarnate.

Taking up our crosses - however heavy the wood, to whatever Calvary that cross takes us - sometimes demands a difficult change in our lives. But in "dying" to ourselves, we can "rise" to the life of God. In some of the hardest words he speaks in the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that real discipleship means to "crucify" our own needs and comfort for that of others; to take on with humility the demanding role of servant to those in need; to intentionally seek the happiness of those we love regardless of the cost to ourselves. Christ calls us to be his disciples exactly where we are. He asks us to take up our crosses in the everyday joys and sorrows we live in our homes and communities.

Peter's urging Jesus not to talk about the passion that is before them and keep it "up beat" is an attempt to deny the reality of suffering. Peter's reaction is much like our own: we readily embrace the reassuring, optimistic Jesus of Easter glory, but back away from the suffering, humiliated, crucified Jesus of Good Friday. For Jesus, the challenge of the pain and disappointment we encounter, is to not sink into self-pity, or deny our anger, or passively accept the role of victim. To follow Jesus is to accept the reality of our suffering and transform such experiences of the cross into moments of resurrection in which generous compassion, humble growth, and selfless consolation are brought to life.
