# **FATHER'S COLUMN**

Jesus replied,

"The first commandment is this:
Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone!
You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart,
with all your soul, with all your mind,
and with all your strength."

To love as God commands and how Jesus teaches requires a spirit of humility which realizes that we are all sons and daughters of God who are called to use whatever gifts we possess, regardless of how small or insignificant they may seem, for the building of his kingdom.

There is no greater sacrifice of praise we can make to God for his many blessings to us, no greater song of thanks we can offer, than to honor God in those who have been created in God's image: our fellow humans.

To love as God loves involves every fiber of our being: our heart, our soul, our mind, our strength. The love of God forces us outside of our comfort zone, to put our own feelings and needs on the line, to risk being hurt or misunderstood for the sake of the beloved Son of God.

In creating us, God invites us to participate in the work of creation by embracing God's spirit of love.

In the Gospel of this Sunday, Jesus lifts up such love as the center of the kingdom of God. Devotion to God is not genuine unless it includes our love for our neighbor; our commitment to others is incomplete without our recognition of God as the Source of all love.

It is in the compassion and kindness extended to others that our humanity most resembles God; it is in the respect and honor in which we hold others that we most praise the God of love; it is in acts of charity and selflessness that we mirror the love of God in our midst.

In the greatest commandment of love, we discover a purpose to our lives much greater and larger than ourselves and our own needs, than our interests, than our prejudices and biases. In loving God in the neighbor, we find the ultimate meaning and purpose of the gifts of faith and life.
