FATHER'S COLUMN

Jesus unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor.

"If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy." These words from the second reading of this Sunday remind us of our complex and intimate interconnectedness with others and with all of God's creation.

There is power and strength in community. If we are willing to accept help from others during our difficult times, we must also stand ready to assist them and others when they experience challenges and hardship. We cannot choose to be part of the community only when it is convenient. Rather, part of living and working in communion with others is recognizing that we all succeed together or fail together.

Part of the communal reality is recognizing and naming our own gifts. When we can name our strengths without self-absorption or false humility, we are able to better recognize how we can use these gifts for the service of others. Saint Paul writes, "God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body." Thus when each person uses their individual gifts for the common good, the community grows and flourishes. The same is true for the workings of our human body.

Today's Gospel offers an example of this, as we hear the very beginning of Luke's writings. Luke tells us that he, like others before him, has compiled a narrative of the life of Jesus. Luke relies on the witness of others in the construction of this story; he himself was not an eyewitness. Rather, Luke uses the gifts God has given him to listen to the stories of those who walked and talked and ate with Jesus so that he may compile them for Theophilus and other future generations. How do we use our own gifts and talents to share the life of Jesus with others?

QUIZ TIME WITH FATHER

Last Week's Answer:

Baptism may be administered by.....

d. unbaptized persons.

Yes, anyone, even a non-Christian may baptize, particularly in case of emergency such as for someone in danger of imminent death. Baptism may be administered by any person, provided that he intends to do what the Catholic Church does (even if he doesn't fully understand what the Church does in Baptism) and uses the right words ("I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit") and actions (pouring or sprinkling water on the recipient's head or immersing the recipient in water). This means that a valid Baptism can be administered by a Jew, a Muslim, a Hindu, an agnostic, or even an atheist. This is testimony not to Christ's capriciousness in establishing Baptism but to how important Baptism is. Our Lord wanted to make Baptism as easily available as possible because this sacrament is the entrance to the life of grace.
