FATHER'S COLUMN

Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."

In the Gospel of this 5th Sunday, Jesus urges Peter not to be afraid of his own sinfulness, his self-perceived unworthiness. We hear this phrase, "Do not be afraid," again and again throughout the Scriptures and it's one of the most repeated reminders the Lord gives us in his teachings.

In the First Letter of St. John we are given a clue as to why. John tells us that "perfect love drives out fear". God desires perfect love in his relationship with us, and in perfect love there is no room for fear.

In the life of faith we are also called to persistence and perseverance. Sometimes things seem hopeless. We have tried again and again to repair a relationship or change a bad habit, but to no avail. Jesus tells Peter to put out his nets into the deep for a catch, and even though he has been fishing all night and caught nothing, he agrees to Jesus' request. His success is beyond his wildest imagining. He catches such an abundance of fish he must call other fishermen to help and partake.

As seen in the Gospel encounter between Peter and Jesus, Christianity is a religion passed on through relationships. The last part of St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians is a discourse on the resurrection of Christ. Today we begin this discourse, which we will read for the next three Sundays.

In building his case for the resurrection of Jesus, Paul cites the many people whom Jesus appeared to after his crucifixion. All of these people passed on what they had heard and seen to invite others to faith. Today, we believe because of what we have experienced, read, and most importantly, because of the testimony of others in our lives. Despite our own failings and weaknesses, we are called like Isaiah (1st reading), Paul (2nd reading), and Simon Peter (Gospel) to witness to Jesus through our persistence, relationships, and a love that casts out fear.
