FATHER'S COLUMN

Raising his eyes toward his disciples Jesus said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation."

Among some of the contemporaries of Saint Luke, there was a presumption that the poor, the hungry, the weeping, and the oppressed, were outside the venue of God's blessings and graciousness. At the same time, it was believed that those who where wealthy and powerful had been blessed by God.

Jesus' sermon corrects these presumptions by teaching that God's blessings are not conditioned by economic or social status but are the free gift of God's graciousness. The only condition for God's blessings is clearly spelled out in the first reading: "trust in the Lord." Similarly, woes are the consequence of those who turn to themselves, "whose hearts turn away from the Lord."

Jesus, following a long biblical tradition, sets up a sharp contrast delineating two ways of life.

The first is the "way of the just" as the Responsorial Psalm mentions it. The way of the just consists in "trusting in the Lord" as we read in the First reading. Those who follow this path are "blessed" as the Lord proclaims in the Gospel.

The second path in life is the "way of the wicked" as equally mentioned in the Responsorial Psalm; which is to "trust in human beings" as we hear from the First reading. Those who follow this path are cursed: the Gospel says, "woe to them." In other words, blessings are available according to whether we trust in the Lord and follow God's way.

In the new world proclaimed by Jesus in the Good News, blessings are signs that we have recognized that the source of everything is God. We are blessed when we surrender to God, and God alone. The Good News in the Gospel of this Sunday is that, whether we are rich or poor, oppressed or secure, if we trust in God, we are blessed. Blessings are dependent simply upon our trusting in God, our placing ourselves in God's hands. Thus, walking in God's way is a blessed life even if one is poor, hungry, or sorrowful; not walking in God's way is a life of woe even if one is rich, full, or content. There is only one way in which a disciple can walk, and that way is to walk in God's way.
